

A REFLECTION

FROM FR. JOHN

Advent is the beginning of the Church year. And in a special way...the Church leads us through Advent to the remembrance of the birth of Jesus Christ, as we celebrate His nativity. The celebration of the incarnation of the Son of God, our Savior and Redeemer, is a special time for Christians around the world.

Each week of Advent the Lectionary of the Church leads us to reflect on our lives in Christ. In this way, we enrich our spiritual lives, taking the time to think about the ways Christ has impacted our lives, and the ways we might share this love of Christ with others.

The scriptures for this weekend call us to be prayerful. We are to remain vigilant and prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. As we light the first candle on our Advent wreath, we should pause to reflect on the Christmas season and what it means to us. Being careful to avoid the anxieties of daily life, we remember that Christmas is a holiday of the heart, not a celebration of trinkets and baubles. Instead, it is a way to deepen our spirituality, our bond with Jesus Christ.

This may take the form of setting aside time to pray, that is to commune, to converse with the Holy Trinity. Prayer comes in many forms, but importantly, it is intentional. To take time to set aside for God is the path toward holiness, the holiness each of us is called to through Holy Mother Church. Saint Paul calls this a

conduct pleasing to God and a strengthening of our heart so as to abound in love.

The Advent wreath is a long tradition in the Church. It is sprinkled with holy water and is blessed before the first candle is lit. The first candle is purple, the liturgical color used as the penitential color of Advent and Lent. The wreath itself is also symbolic. It is composed of evergreen boughs, a symbol representing everlasting life.


Our Advent wreath will be blessed at Saturday's vigil Mass at Saint Mary and at the beginning of Mass at Saint Joan of Arc. The wreath is blessed using the following formula:

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath.

May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. **R/. Amen.**
