OTHER ITEMS OF NOTE

Qualified Charitable Distributions to the Parish - If you are over 70 ½, consider making charitable donations from your IRA using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This would be a great way to grow the parish endowments, help with a special project, or pay your weekly giving in one lump sum. While a QCD does not generate a charitable deduction, you do not have to report the income. This is a great option for people to still get a tax benefit even though they are not able to itemize deductions. Charitable deduction rules can be very complicated, and you should work with your tax advisor to ensure you are maximizing the tax benefit of any donation.
