# **A REFLECTION**

FROM FR. JOHN

Jesus tells us in today's gospel "...the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." Jesus is asking us to look beyond our humanity and to imitate Him. Who among you can say, I never look down on others?

When we interact with others, either consciously or unconsciously, we judge them for their mistakes; we judge them for belonging to this group or that group; we judge their cloths, their height, weight, proportions, their poverty or wealth, their success or failure. Yes, it is hard to stop judging.

Jesus commands us, stop judging or you will be judged. Jesus is the just judge; according to the Catechism..."Each man receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a particular judgment that refers his life to Christ: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven- through a purification- or immediately- or immediate and everlasting damnation." Heaven and hell are the reasons to avoid judging others.

But Jesus asks much of us, doesn't He? Sometimes, the best we might hope for is to change our ingrained habits and become more like Him. One thing we might try, is to put ourselves in the other person's shoes. How might it feel to be defined by the worst decision you have ever made? Most of us need only look at our past to understand, we lack perfection!

Empathy allows us tender understanding. It doesn't mean we must accept other people without exception; but it does mean you gain the ability to see the other is flawed, just as we have flaws; and we share a broken world, full of sin and death.

Learn to take the time to reflect on your own flaws. The more accepting of our own flaws we might be, the more accepting you are to the flaws of others. The peace of Christ will help you reduce your hostility and judgment. Pattern your life to the golden rule, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." I am confident no one wants to be judged.

Compassion is that trait which is the opposite of condescension. In compassion, we see others with mercy, just as Jesus sees us. If you cannot care about others enough to help, don't waste your mental efforts on gloating over their mistakes. Instead arm yourself with patience, be kind, and turn your back on judgment.
