

# A REFLECTION

(Adapted from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops)

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated on Holy Thursday. Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when he established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood. The Roman Missal indicates, "After the Homily, where a pastoral reason suggests it, the Washing of Feet follows." The Eucharist is moved from the tabernacle to outside the Church proper and the altar is stripped of its adornments. Holy water is removed from entrances of the Church.

Good Friday of the Lord's Passion commemorates Jesus Christ's Passion, crucifixion, and death. The veneration of the Cross is the showing of the Holy Cross, wherein the priest or deacon goes to the church door or sacristy, where he takes up the uncovered Cross. Accompanied by two

ministers with lighted candles, he processes to the sanctuary, stopping at the door of the church, in the middle of the church, and before entering the sanctuary, to sing the acclamation, "Behold the wood of the Cross." The people venerate the Cross by touching it, kissing it, or by bowing before it. The Eucharist is confected on Holy Thursday and reserved for Good Friday service.

The Vigil of the Resurrection, by its very nature, must take place at night. Fire is blessed and the paschal candle is lighted to illumine the night so that all may hear the Easter proclamation and listen to the word of God proclaimed in the Scriptures. One of the unique aspects of the Easter Vigil is the recounting of the outstanding deeds of the history of salvation. These deeds are related in seven readings from the Old Testament chosen from the law and the prophets and two readings from the New Testament, namely from the Apostle Paul and from the Gospel. The celebrant, before he says, "Behold the Lamb of God", may make a brief remark to the neophytes about their first Communion and about the importance of so great a mystery, which is the climax of initiation and the center of the Christian life.

Easter Sunday Mass is to be celebrated with great solemnity. The rite of the renewal of baptismal promises may take place after the homily, followed by the sprinkling with water blessed at the Vigil. The holy water fonts at the entrance to the church should also be filled with the same water. Liturgical music reflects the great joy of the Resurrection.


