

A REFLECTION

FROM FR. JOHN

Easter was a beautiful celebration at St. Mary and St. Joan of Arc. Not since Christmas has the Church been so filled with the faithful offering praise to God. We celebrated Easter with all the solemnity and joy it deserves as the celebration of the rising Christ, our Savior, the light of the world! Easter is the high point of our liturgical year, but Easter doesn't end on Easter Sunday, it is just the beginning! For the Catholic Church, the Easter season begins with Easter, this year April 17, 2022 and runs for fifty days until Pentecost Sunday on June 5.

This is the entire season of Easter, fifty days wherein we remember and rejoice in Christ's victory over sin and death. Like the Easter Candle we use at each Mass, we are to be intentional in using the Easter season for what it is, namely, a time when we fully accept, to the best of our ability, the saving grace of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Special feasts mark the passage of the Easter Season. This weekend we will celebrate **Divine Mercy Sunday**. In a time of division, confusion, and world strife, we, as a people, need to feel, experience, and celebrate the mercy of the Lord. This promise of mercy has been affirmed by the Church, which has made Divine Mercy Sunday an occasion for receiving a plenary indulgence, "the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sin whose guilt has already been forgiven" (CCC 1471).

Come pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00 PM Sunday.

Forty days following Easter, the Paschal Mystery is capped by the Ascension of Jesus to the right hand of the Father. After his appearance here on earth in his risen body, and "after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen" (Acts 1:2), Jesus "was lifted up and a cloud took him from their sight" (Acts 1:9). This is the holy feast of Ascension Thursday, properly Thursday of the Sixth week of Easter. Because of the importance for all Catholics to attend Mass on the Solemnity of the Ascension, the Solemnity is celebrated in our diocese on the Sunday following that Thursday, this year on Sunday, May 29.

The following Sunday comes the fiftieth day following Easter, Pentecost Sunday. On Pentecost, we celebrate the occasion of God sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples after his Resurrection. The book of Acts describes how the disciples were gathered together in one place on the day of Pentecost and the Holy Spirit came upon them, like a great rushing wind, appearing upon them as tongues of fire. Pentecost crowns and fulfills our Easter season. With longing for the coming of Christ, we pray on Pentecost for a deeper connection and interaction with the power and movement of the Holy Spirit. As our Easter season concludes, the Paschal Candle is extinguished and moved to its permanent location.
