

A REFLECTION

FROM FR. JOHN

Saint Thomas Aquinas, the angelic Doctor of the Church, said, "justice is a habit wherein we render to each one his due by a constant and perpetual will." At first glance, this seems very simple, but looking deeper, we see important implications for the modern Church.

A habit is a behavior done so many times, we begin to do it without thinking, the behavior becomes a part of us. What this tells us is that we can't practice justice in different ways to different receivers of justice. Instead, by using justice over and over, justice is engrained in our very thoughts. Holy Mother Church deserves our allegiance and is owed this very justice.

Justice is a habit that renders each their due. The Church warrants this justice, and yet we constantly see attacks on the Church, from within and without, and against its authority. Disunity and discord are the rallying cries for those against unity in the Church. Christ Himself commanded the authority of the Church telling Simon Peter, "I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it." (Matt 16:18) Peter was the first in a long line of Popes that extends through history to Pope Francis, our current bishop of the Holy See of Rome.

Justice is meted out by us in a constant and perpetual will. Justice is not to be used sometimes and not others. Because it becomes a habit through repeated use, our will seeks justice in all aspects of our worldliness. Specifically, in our dealings with the world, our interaction with charity, and in our witness of injustice, the virtue of justice drives us towards the good. It is up to us to bring this justice to the Church through the power of unity. Jesus notes the value of unity saying, "Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and no city or house divided against itself will stand." (Matt 12:26)

Justice is particularly important in a small church like St. Mary or St. Joan of Arc. Our unity is just as important as the unity of the entire Church. Equality, mercy, and love, is our call for justice; each supports the unity of the Church. We desire justice for the Church, and it's up to us to get it. That justice begins at the local level in family, extends to our Parishes, through the Pastor, extends to the Bishop, going all the way up the ladder to the Pope himself. This is the path towards fulfilling the mission of Jesus Christ. Let us speak out against division in the Church as we seek justice for her.
