A REFLECTION

FROM DEACON ALBERT

Fire and wind. Anyone who has ever paid attention to wildfire season across the U.S. knows what a dangerous combination this can be. Fire and wind. This is how infernos are created. When the wind is strong the fire burns out of control. It doesn't seem to matter what those people who are trying to contain the fire do, if the wind is strong, the fire Just keeps spreading, consuming everything in its path, burning on and on.

The apostles were on fire. At first, they had been anything but fiery. When Jesus was arrested, they ran away. Then went into hiding, afraid they would meet the same fate. After the resurrection, things were better. But then Jesus had ascended, and they were alone again. But this time, staying together in the upper room, they were not hiding in fear. They were waiting in expectation, waiting on the promise that Jesus had made to them to be fulfilled. They were waiting on the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to come to them.

The Acts of the Apostles tells us there was a great noise from the sky like a strong driving wind, and tongues of fire appeared over them. They were on fire. Filled with the Spirit, they could no longer stay out of sight, they were no longer able to contain the message of the Gospel within themselves. Driven by the Holy Spirit, just like flames driven by the wind, they went out into the streets, publicly proclaiming the message of the Gospel: That the crucified Jesus of Nazareth had risen from the dead and was made Lord and Messiah by the Father, and Salvation and forgiveness of sins was available in His name.

The fire was started, and the wind was strong. Acts goes on to tell us that 3,000 people were baptized that first day, and the numbers increased greatly every day after. It didn't matter what those who were in charge of preventing the spread of the fire did, it kept growing ever larger. Even when there was some success in stamping out a portion of the fire, such as the martyrdom of St. Stephen, the wind would blow harder, and the fire would grow stronger. Eventually, even some of those in charge of fighting the fire would themselves be consumed by it.

One of the chief firefighters, Saul of Tarsus was eventually caught up in the fire and himself became fuel for it. And just as fire changes what it burns, Saul, the main persecutor of the early Church, became St. Paul, the Apostle to the gentiles. And he, with the rest of the Apostles, like burning embers or flaming brambles were driven across the lands, spreading the fire everywhere they went. Renewing the face of the earth.

Today we celebrate that original Pentecost. Just like those first disciples we can pray for the Holy Spirit to come upon us and fill us with its fire. Come, Holy Spirit, Fill the Hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

And renew the face of the earth. Like fire and wind.
