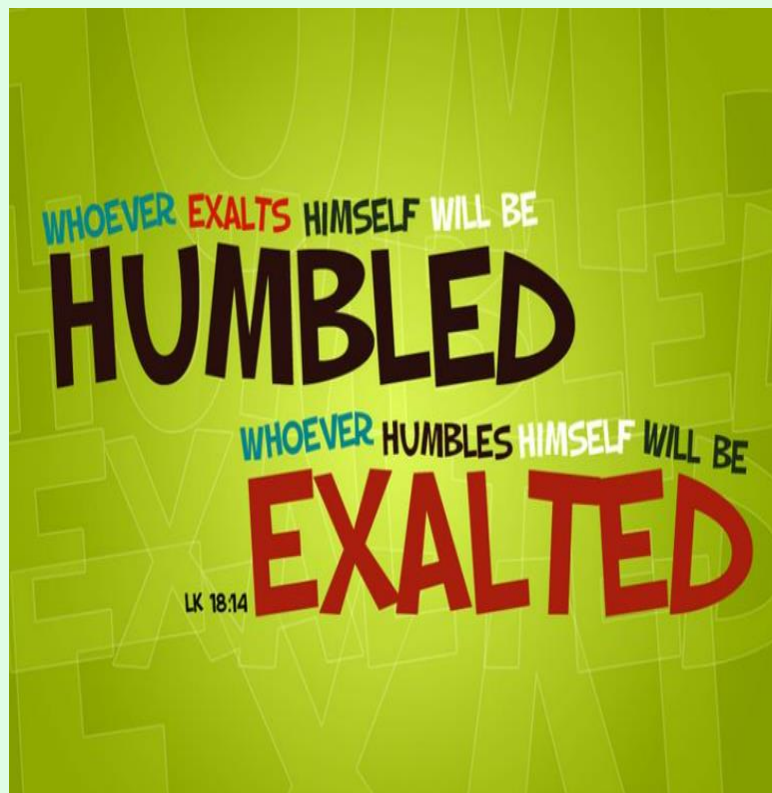

A REFLECTION

FROM FR. SURESH

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

On the first evening of their visit with their grandmother, a young boy and his brother knelt by their bed to pray. Shouting as loudly as he could, the younger boy pleaded. . . “and PLEASE God, I need a new bicycle and a pair of roller blades.” “Shh!” said the older boy, “not so loud. God isn’t deaf, you know!” To which his younger brother replied. “Yes, I know, but Grandma is.” Technically, the boy *was* praying to God but, like the Pharisee in today’s Gospel, he was doing so simply to benefit himself.

In the gospel of this week, Jesus tells us a parable about two men who went to pray, a Pharisee and a tax collector. The Pharisee stood in the very front section of the Temple, as close to God’s Holy of Holies as he could get and distancing himself from his inferiors; his prayer was egotistical and selfish. He looked upon himself as superior to other people and listed all his pious acts. He wants his prayers to be heard and answered by God by all means. The way he prayed looks like he did not give any option to God other than answering his prayer. Should our prayer be this way?

Devout Jews observed three prayer-times daily, at nine AM, twelve midday and three PM. They also considered prayer in the Temple as more efficacious than that made anywhere else because God was Present there. The pharisee in the parable is a good man but with bad intention. We all should pray daily without failure as the pharisee and Jews did, but we should not pray with the same intensions as the Pharisee in Jesus’s parable.

All the Jews of Jesus time had the good habit going to synagogue to pray on every Saturday. How often do you attend Sunday Mass in our parish? Let us reflect?
