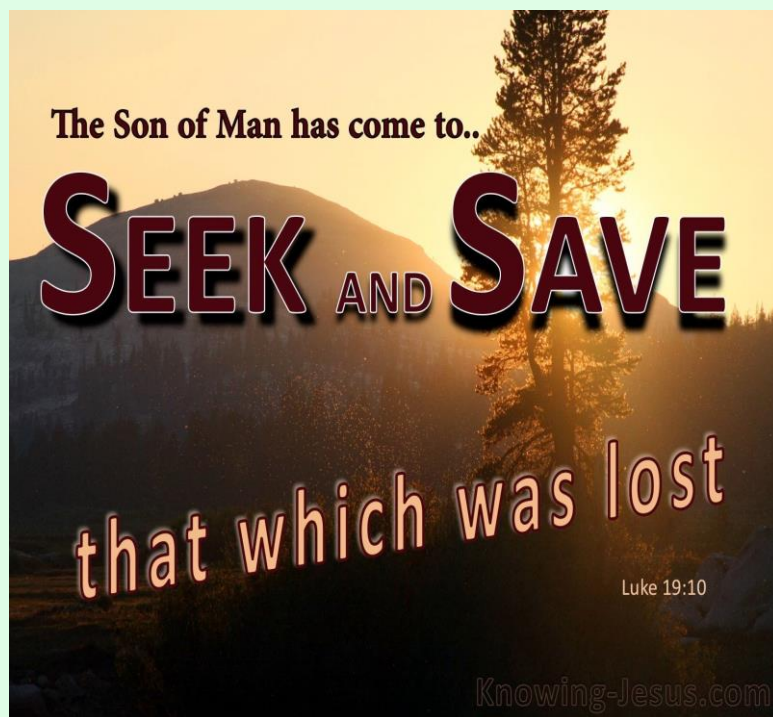

A REFLECTION

FROM FR. SURESH

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Jesus Christ,

In this week's gospel passage we will here that our Lord Jesus' demands, to Zacchaeus "I must stay at your house today?"

How would we react to such an invitation? Would we be ready to welcome Jesus into our home? Indeed, Jesus has visited the homes of each and every one of us! Through the Sacrament of Confirmation, we have received the indwelling Spirit of Christ within us.

Through the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, we receive the Divine Presence of the Lord. Further, if we love one another, God lives in us, and His love is perfected in us.

Hence, let us be thankful to the Lord for coming to us. For those of us who have not yet received the Lord into our homes and lives, or missed receiving him due to pandemic it is never too late to repent and welcome Him.

Our Lord is a God of Love, Grace and Mercy. He does not wish to see anyone lost. If we allow Jesus to enter our lives, our lives will change. Grace is driving power behind this transformation.

Let us pray for one and another that the good and gracious Lord to dwell in our homes and lives. Ask the Lord daily in your prayers to reach out to us all as he reached out to Zacchaeus. The result will be repentance, transformation, sanctification, salvation.

It is also our duty to see our children receive the Eucharistic Lord through sacraments, so don't hesitate or delay to prepare our children for the First Holy Communion.
