FROM FR. SURESH

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Jesus Christ,

Greetings to you all.

In this week's gospel Our Lord Jesus states, "That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out Lord, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive." Jesus speaks of God as the God of the living and declares that heavenly life with God in glory is totally different from earthly life.

The reason we come together each week to pray for the needs of the community, share the Word and break the Bread is that we have Faith and Hope in a living God Who loves us and Whom we love. If God is the God of the living, should not worship of this God also be alive?

Worship services and relation to God must be life-giving rather than life-draining experiences. Unfortunately, Holy Mass and other worship services are often described as "dead" or "boring."
